Dental Nurse

What do they do?

Your day-to-day tasks may include:

- passing instruments to the dentist or hygienist
- removing water and saliva from the patient's mouth during treatment
- preparing materials to make fillings
- making sure that the patient is relaxed and comfortable at all times
- keeping the surgery tidy and sterile
- sterilizing instruments
- helping record information about each patient
- Assist in reception area, and administration booking appointments, taking payments for treatment and greeting and reassuring patients.

You may work at a general dental practice, a hospital, with the community dental service or in a university. You could also work in the armed forces.

Skills required

- the ability to relate well to people, including children and those with special needs
- excellent communication and listening skills
- practical and organisational skills
- a calm, confident and reassuring manner
- be flexible and follow procedures in pressured situations.

How to become a Dental Nurse

To get into this job you can either:

You can either:

- take a full-time college course in dental nursing
- start on a traineeship or a an apprenticeship with a dental practice to train on the job

In both cases, you'll need to study for a qualification approved by the <u>General Dental Council</u> (GDC) and register with the GDC. Approved courses include

- Level 3 Diploma in Dental Nursing
- National Diploma in Dental Nursing awarded by the National Examining Board for Dental Nurses (NEBDN)
- Certificate of Higher Education in Dental Nursing (full-time)
- Foundation Degree in Dental Nursing (full-time)

To train on the job, most employers will prefer you to have a good general standard of education, such as GCSEs (A-C) including English, maths and/or science. Full-time courses may require evidence of A-level or AS-level study.

You will also need to pass background checks by the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS).
